The 2019 MPSA Annual Conference Program Chairs and Section Heads invite you to submit proposals that reflect the best thinking in the discipline, informed by theory, research and practical application. The committee invites proposals in over 80 sections in a variety of formats from all political science subfields. Program participants are not required to be MPSA members, though all participating presenters are required to register for the conference and MPSA members receive significant registration discounts.

Conference Scholarships are Available to MPSA Members

NEW! - John Bohte Memorial Graduate Student Travel Scholarship - The John Bohte Memorial Conference Travel Award to fund travel to the MPSA annual meeting in Chicago for graduate students presenting research in the subfield of public policy/public administration.

Harrell Rodger Graduate Student Travel Scholarship - This scholarship provides \$500 in travel assistance for MPSA student members to attend the annual conference. The number of scholarships varies in any given year.

Conference Registration Fee Waiver Scholarship - Fee waivers are provided to individuals on the program who are either 1) scholars studying at an institution in the developing world, or 2) not political scientists or from related fields and have not attended in the past.

Conference Childcare Scholarship - Assistance to help defray 60 percent (up to \$300 of support) for childcare during the annual conference is offered to attendees who are current members of the MPSA (with an annual income below \$75,000) and who are staying at the Palmer House or Hilton Chicago.
